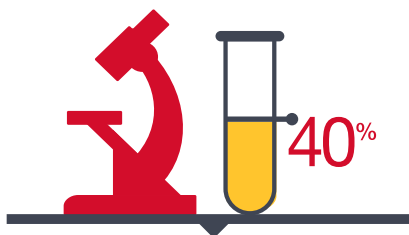

In 1964, the five-year survival rate for children with the most commonly diagnosed pediatric leukemia was 3%. Today it's approximately 90%.

More than 40% of new cancer therapies approved by the FDA between 2000 and 2015 were first approved to treat blood cancer patients

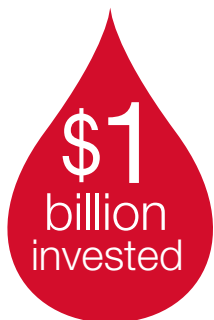


survival rates
